Safety Information

WARNING! This shower can deliver scalding temperatures. For continued safe operation, follow all instructions, warnings and cautions contained in this guide and on or inside the shower. Periodic maintenance may be required to keep the product in good working order.

The function of a thermostatic mixing valve is to deliver water consistently at a safe temperature. In keeping with every other mechanism, it cannot be considered as functionally infallible and as such, cannot totally replace a supervisor's vigilance where that is necessary. Provided it is installed, commissioned, operated and maintained within manufacturers recommendations, the risk of failure, if not eliminated, is reduced to the minimum achievable.

PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING TO REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY:

Installing the Shower

1. Installation of the shower must be carried out in accordance with the instructions by qualified, competent personnel. Read all instructions before installing the shower.
2. **DO NOT** install the shower where it may be exposed to freezing conditions. Ensure that any pipework that could become frozen is properly insulated.
3. **DO NOT** perform any unspecified modifications to the shower or its accessories. When servicing only use genuine Kohler Mira replacement parts.
4. If the shower is dismantled during installation or servicing then, upon completion, an inspection must be made to ensure all connections are tight and that there are no leaks.
5. The product may be TMV3 or TMV2 approved. Refer to the installation guide for information regarding product type and installation suitability.

Using the Shower

6. The shower must be operated and maintained in accordance with the requirements of the installation and user guides. Make sure you read all this information fully and understand how to operate the shower before use. Retain all guides for future reference.
7. **DO NOT** switch the shower on if there is a possibility that the water in the shower unit or fittings is frozen.
8. The water supplies to this product must be isolated if the product is not to be used for a period of time. For example, When away on holiday. If the product or pipework is at risk of freezing during this period, they should also be drained of water.
9. This product is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
10. Anyone who may have difficulty understanding or operating the controls of any shower should be attended whilst showering. Particular consideration should be given to the young, the elderly, the infirm or anyone inexperienced in the correct operation of the controls.
11. **DO NOT** allow children to play with the shower, clean or perform any user maintenance to the shower or it's fittings e.g. Handset and hose.
12. Always check the water temperature is safe before entering the shower.
13. **DO NOT** adjust the temperature control rapidly while using the shower.
14. **DO NOT** switch the shower off and back on while standing in the water flow. Use caution when altering the water temperature while in use and always check the temperature before continuing to shower.
15. **DO NOT** restrict the water flow from the shower outlet, temporarily bending the shower hose or blocking the shower head while in use could cause a hot shot of water to be discharged.

16. When adjusting the handset mode, point handset away from body and make sure the water temperature has stabilised before continuing to shower.
17. The showerheads must be descaled regularly and hose checked for blockage or damage. Blocked showerheads or hose will affect showering performance.
18. **DO NOT** connect the outlet of the shower to any tap, control valve, trigger operated handset or showerhead other than those specified for use with this shower. Only Kohler Mira recommended accessories should be used.
19. For products with multiple shower outlets, the diverters or on/off controls must be regularly operated to ensure the correct operation of the outlet.
20. This appliance is intended to be permanently connected to the water supplies and not connected by flexible hoses.

Thermostatic Shut-down

- For safety and comfort the thermostat will shut off the mixing valve **within 2 Seconds** if either supply fails (achieved only if the blend temperature has a minimum differential of 12°C from either supply temperature).

Suitable Plumbing Installations

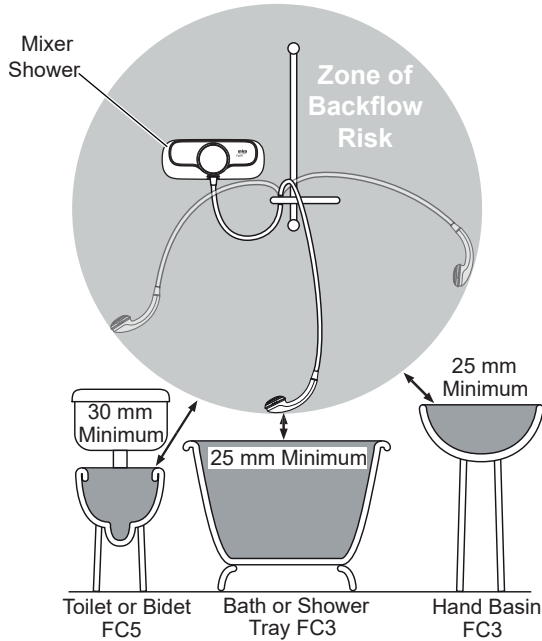
The Thermostatic Mixer can be installed with all systems with balanced pressures. Mixed gravity and mains supplies are not recommended.

Installation

General

1. Installation of the shower must be carried out in accordance with these instructions by qualified, competent personnel.
2. The plumbing installation must comply with all national or local water regulations and all relevant building regulations, or any particular regulation or practice specified by the local water supply company.
3. Make sure all pressures and temperatures comply with the requirements of the shower. See '**Specifications**'.
4. Full bore/non restrictive servicing valves must be fitted in a readily accessible position adjacent to the shower to facilitate maintenance of the shower.
DO NOT use a valve with a loose washer plate (jumper) as this can lead to a buildup of static pressure.
5. **DO NOT** apply excessive force to plumbing connections; always provide mechanical support when making plumbing connections. Any soldered joints should be made before connecting the shower.
6. Pipework dead-legs should be kept to a minimum.
7. **DO NOT** install the shower unit in a position where access for maintenance is restricted.
8. The shower must be fitted to a waterproof, flat and even wall surface. The four screws and wall plugs supplied are suitable for most solid wall installations. Alternative fixing screws for panel structures are not supplied. Use all four fixing points to secure the shower, be sure to use fixings appropriate for the chosen wall structure.
9. Pipework enters the product from the rear through a hole in the wall, provision must be made to prevent water ingress back into the wall structure.
10. Position the shower unit where the controls are at a convenient height for the user. Position the showerhead so that the water sprays in line with the bath or across the opening of a shower cubicle. The installation must not cause the shower hose to be kinked during normal use.
11. The water supplies to this product should be isolated if the product is not to be used for a long period of time. If the product or pipework is at risk of freezing during this period they should also be drained of water.

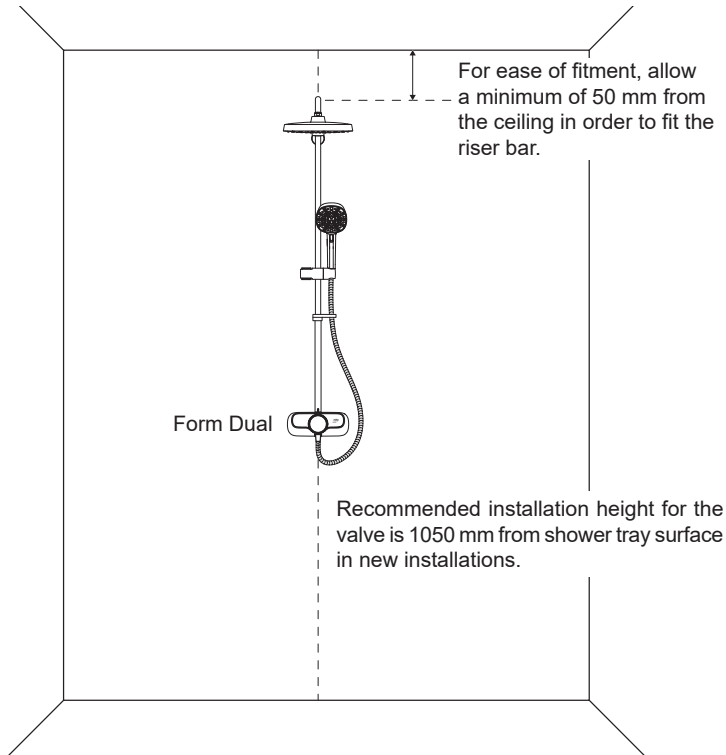
12. The position of the shower and shower fittings must provide a minimum air gap of 25 mm between the showerhead and the spill over level of any bath, shower tray or basin. There must be a minimum distance of 30 mm between the showerhead and the spill over level of any toilet, bidet or other appliance with a Fluid Category 5 backflow risk.



Note: There will be occasions when the hose retaining ring will not provide a suitable solution for Fluid Category 3 installations. In these instances an outlet double checkvalve must be fitted, this will increase the required supply pressure typically by 10kPa (0.1 bar). Double checkvalves fitted in the inlet supply to the appliance cause a pressure build up, which affects the maximum static inlet pressure for the appliance and must not be fitted. For Fluid Category 5, double checkvalves are not suitable.

Shower Positioning

The shower fittings should be positioned at a convenient height for all the family. Position the fittings to spray across rather than towards the opening of the cubicle and also away from the shower control. Avoid layouts where the shower hose will be sharply kinked. This may reduce the life of the hose.



Critical! The installation area must be carefully prepared and all tiles cut or drilled accurately for a successful installation.

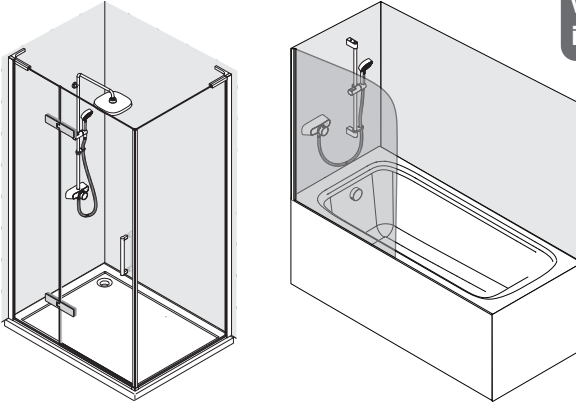

2 Replacement Installation

The adjustable elbows each have adjustment, allowing your thermostatic mixer to be connected to pipe centres ranging from 110 mm to 155 mm.

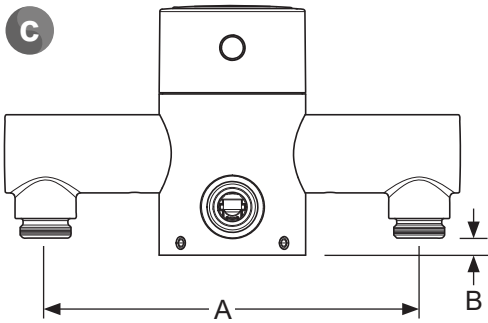
a Carefully remove the existing product and place on a flat surface. Refer to the installation guide supplied with the product for any help.



Inlet pipes must extend 10-27 mm from the finished wall surface, and be square to the wall. If pipes are longer than 27 mm cut and deburr pipe to a suitable length.

Measure the distance between the two inlet pipes (**Distance A**).

If the distance between the two inlet pipes centres is not 153 mm, remove the retaining clips as shown and recycle them.

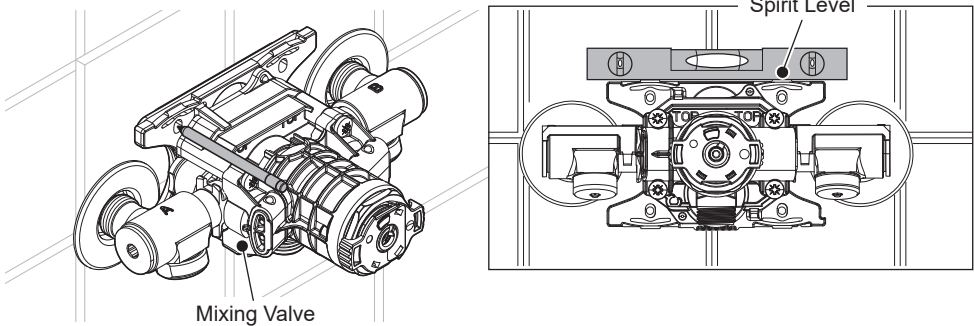


Measure the distance between the inlet face and the flat surface (**Distance B**) for the previously installed product.

Refer to the table below to find the correct configuration for the inlet connections.

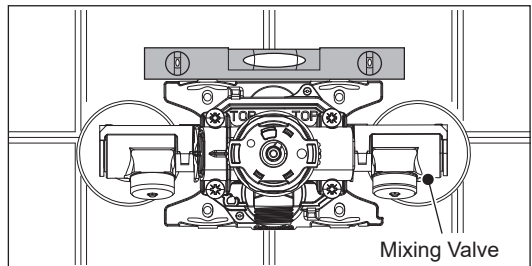
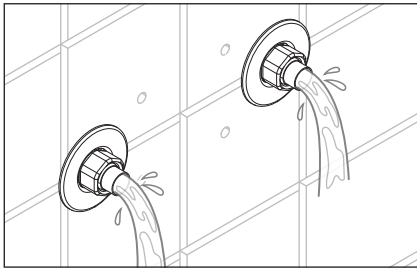
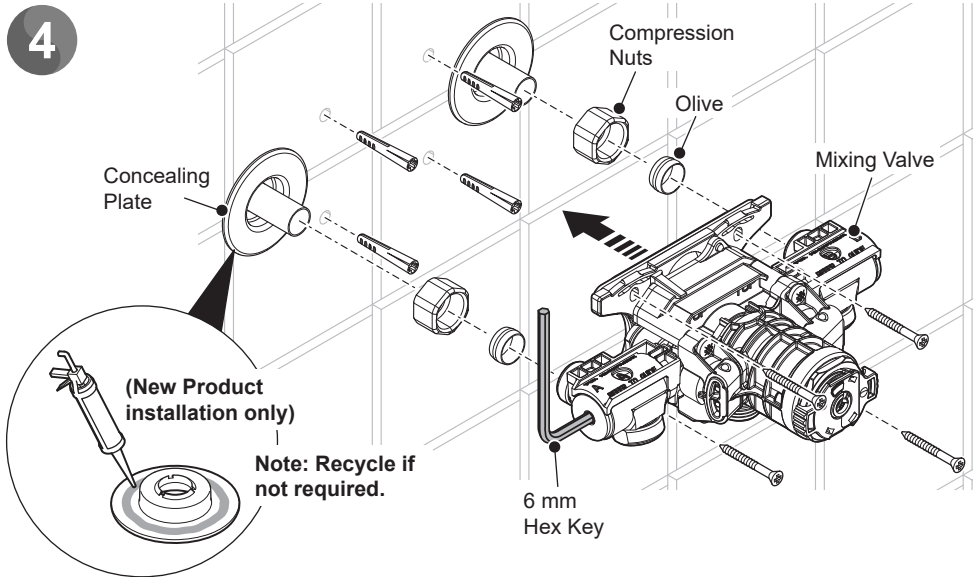
Ø 6mm drill required for wall plugs supplied



Drill the four fixing holes for the backplate.

DO NOT drill through the backplate into the wall.

DO NOT drill into buried cables or pipes.



Flush the water supplies thoroughly before connecting the mixing valve.

Note: Identification on the mixing valve shows the orientation that the valve must be fixed to the wall. Ensure the “TOP” marking faces to top of the product.

Place the concealing plates, compression nuts and olives (**new installation only**) over the pipes.

Place the mixing valve over the inlet pipes. Finger tighten both the compression nuts and then fix the mixing valve to the wall using the wall screws (x4) and wall plugs provided. Retighten the compression nuts using a suitable spanner while supporting the elbow with a 6 mm hex key as shown.

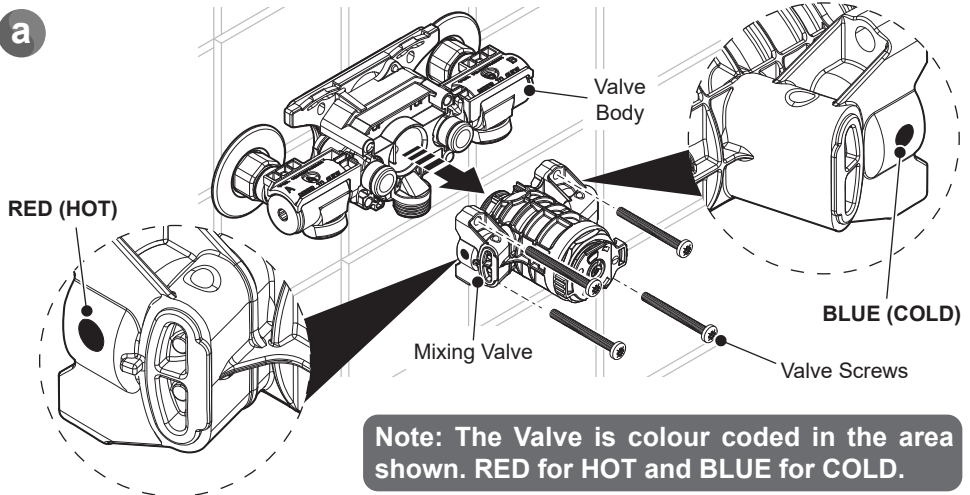
Check for leaks.

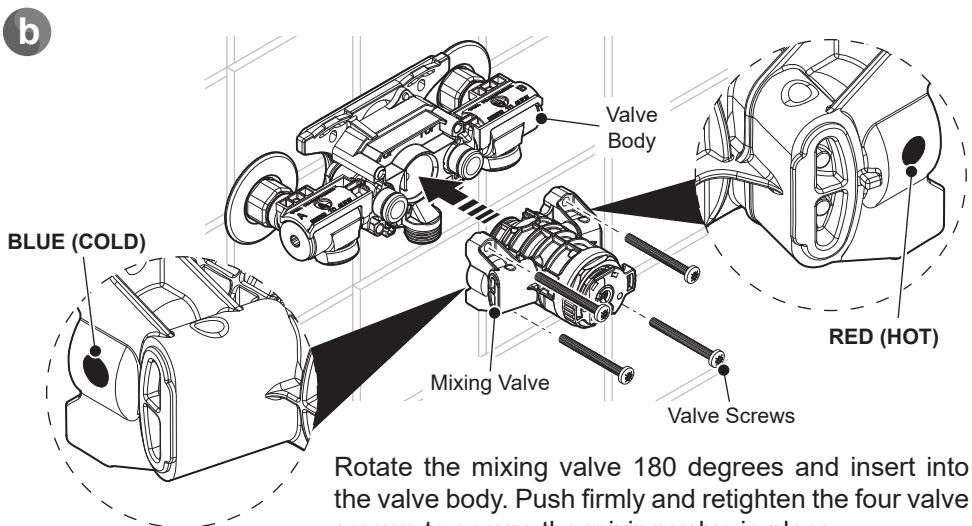
5 Reversed Inlet Supplies

If the **HOT** water supply is on the **RIGHT HAND** side, the shower's control cartridge must be reversed. The following steps show how to swap the hot and cold water inlet positions of the cartridge.

Isolate the water supplies and turn the shower on/off to relieve the water pressure.



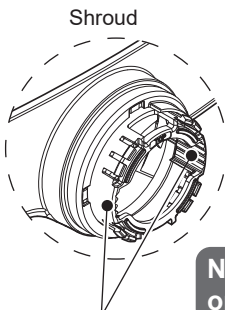
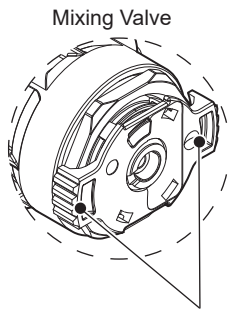
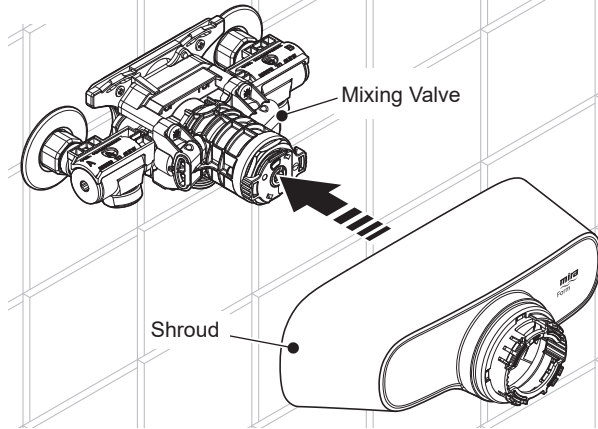
Loosen the four valve screws and remove the mixing valve from the valve body.



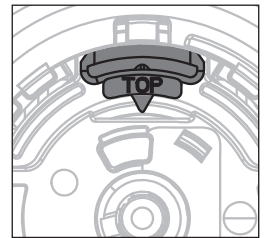
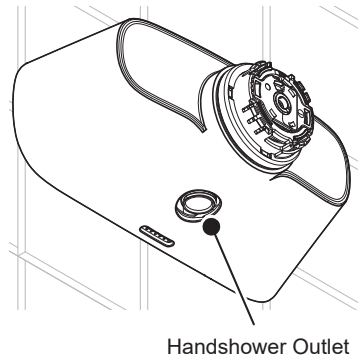

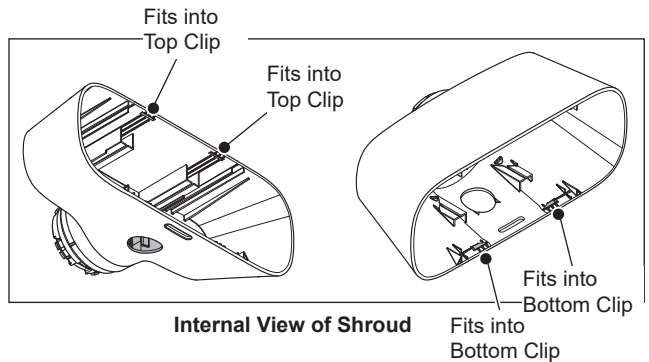

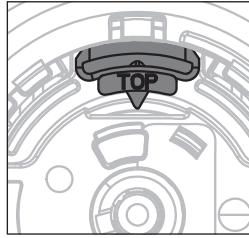


Internal View of Shroud

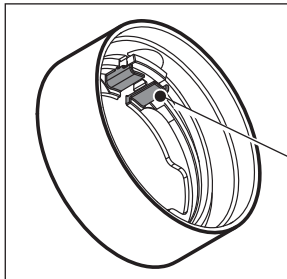
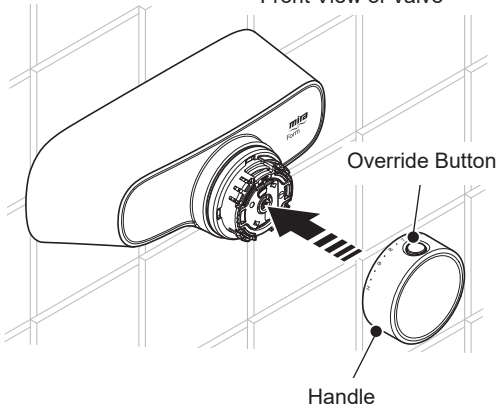

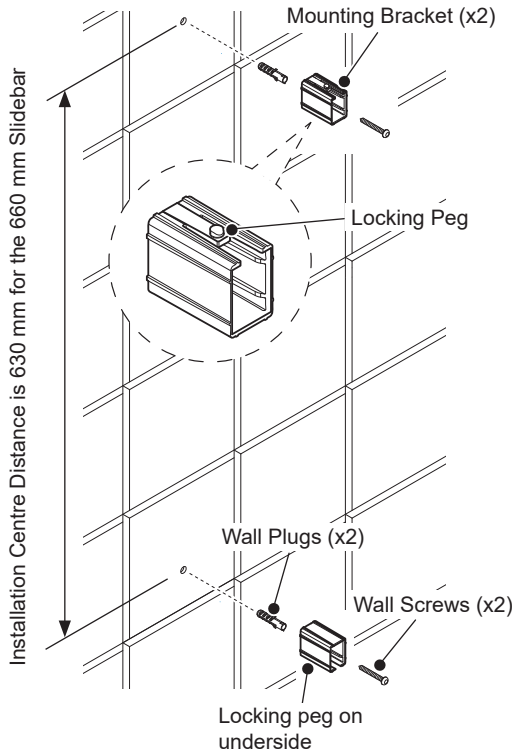

Mark the wall fixing positions and drill two holes to suit the wall fixings.

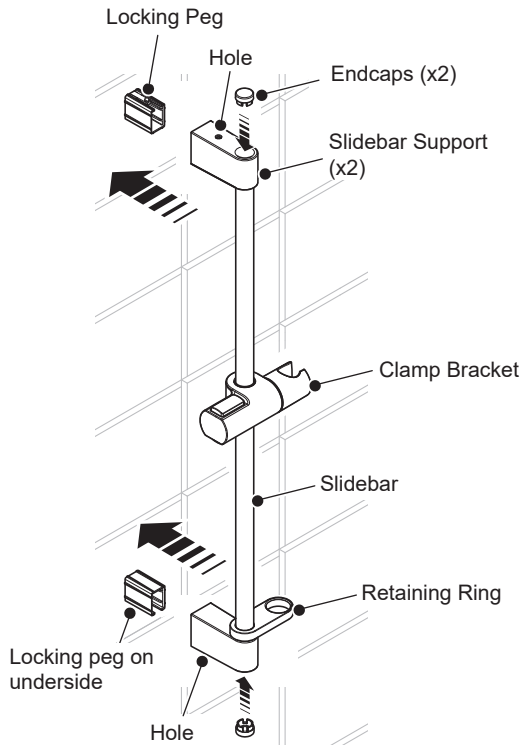
Caution! Do not drill into cables or pipes in the wall.

Note: Installation fixing centres are 630 mm for the 660 mm sidebar. 660 mm recommended for new installations.

Install the wall plugs and the mounting brackets and secure with the wall screws.

Note: Verify that the locking peg is orientated correctly.

Note: Check for vertical alignment before tightening. The mounting brackets are slotted to aid this alignment. Then fully tighten.

Install the clamp bracket, the hose retaining ring (smallest hole) and the slidebar supports to the slidebar.

Note: Orientate the hole on the slidebar supports in line with the locking peg on mounting bracket.

Ensure an equal length of slidebar protrudes from the top and bottom slidebar support (or flush with the end of the slidebar for new installations) and push onto mounting brackets. Ensure it clicks into place.

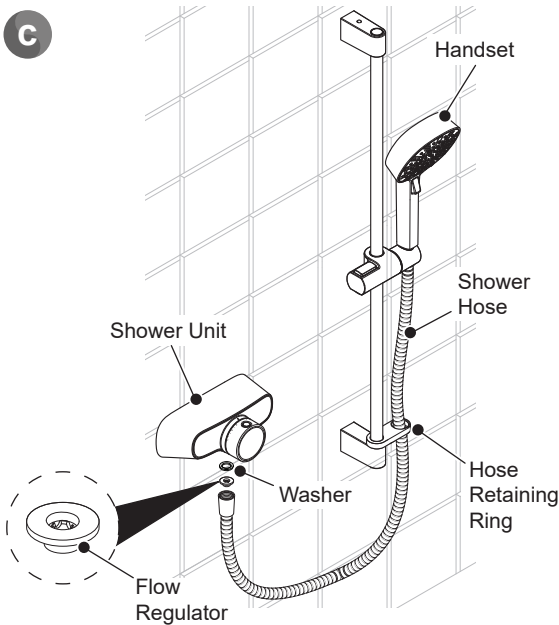
Caution! DO NOT force assembly onto the mounting brackets. Re-align slidebar support if required.

Important! Ensure that the locking peg clicks in and is fully engaged in the hole in the slidebar support.

Install the endcaps, push fit into both ends of the slidebar.

Note: Slidebar support removal. Using a suitable tool, push and hold down the locking peg through the hole in the slidebar support and pull off.

Information for Flow Regulators:

For maintained (running) water pressure greater than 0.5 bar, installing a flow regulator can help to reduce:

- Energy and water consumption
- Excessive shower force
- Noise due to high or unequal water pressure
- Unstable supply temperature

Hose and Handshower Installation

Fit a hose seal into the end of the hose and screw onto the outlet of the valve. (Install the flow regulator if required).

Caution! DO NOT over tighten.

Feed the hose through the hose retaining ring.

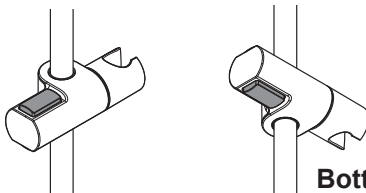
Fit a hose seal into the end of the hose and screw onto the handshower.

Caution! DO NOT over tighten.

Place the handshower into the clamp bracket assembly.

Only use the supplied handset with this product.

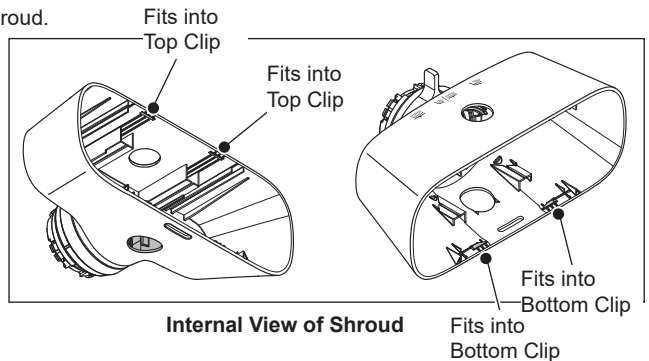

Front View of Valve

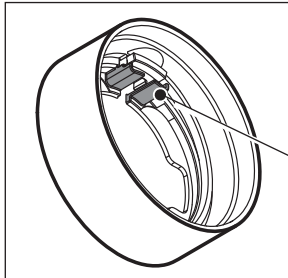

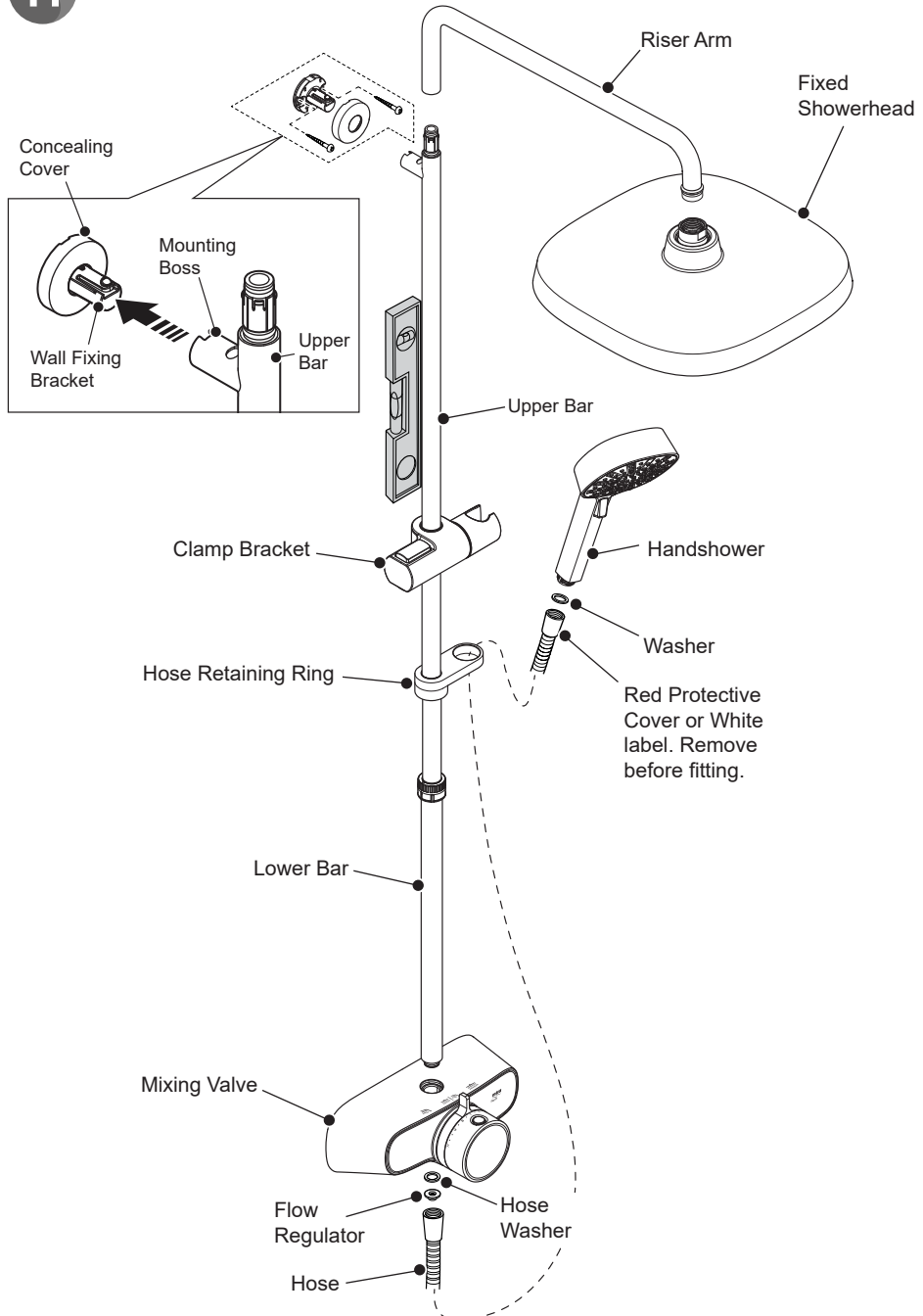


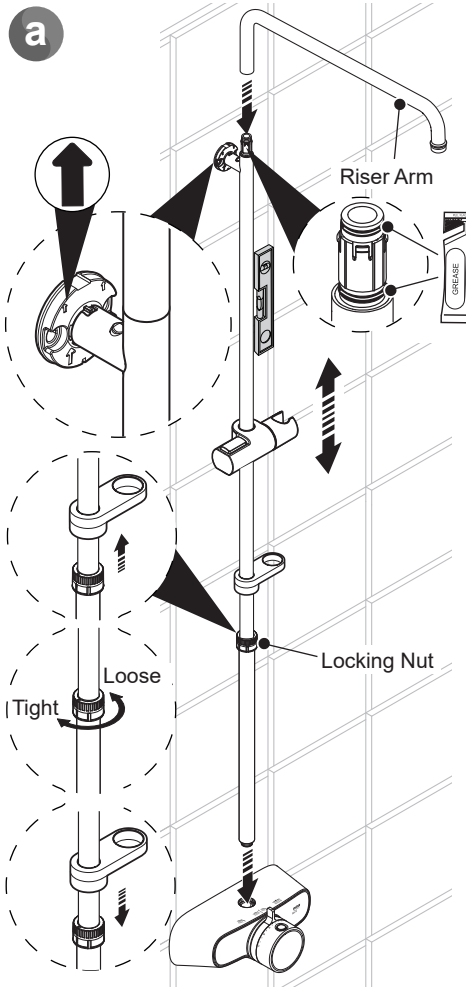
Internal View of Handle

Installation of Dual Outlet Shower Fitting





Insert the wall fixing bracket into the upper bar mounting boss, then swivel the bar if necessary to reposition the wall fixing bracket against the wall.

Note: The UP arrows must be positioned facing upwards.

Apply a small amount of grease (supplied) to the two seals to aid installation.

Push fit the riser arm to the upper bar section.

Push the lower bar fully into the top of the mixing valve.

Note: The lower bar must be located correctly, push down firmly to seat it.

The upper bar is adjustable in length. Adjust the riser arm to a convenient height for all the users and tighten the locking nut.

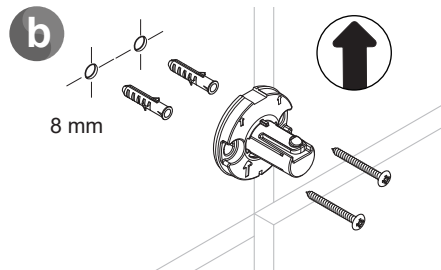
Note: DO NOT extend telescopic riser arm beyond "MAX" marking.

Slide the retaining ring over the locking nut.

Mark the holes for the wall fixing bracket.

Note: Use a spirit level to ensure the bar is vertical.

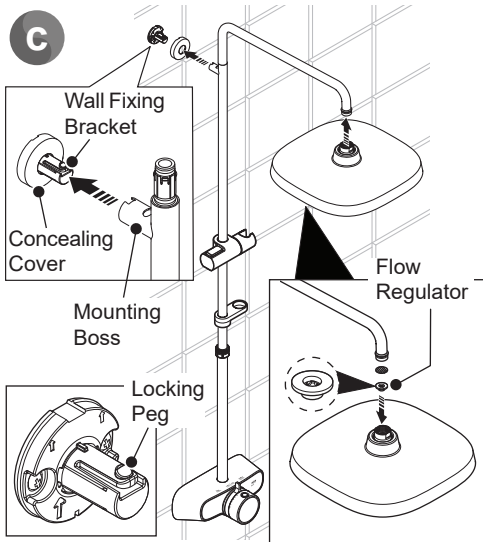
Remove the lower bar from the mixing valve then remove the wall fixing bracket from the mounting boss.



Note: When drilling the tiles ensure this is done in the middle or towards the bottom of the marked slots.

Drill two holes to suit the wall fixings, ensuring that the valve is protected from debris. Fix the bracket to the wall.

Note: The UP arrows must be positioned facing upwards.



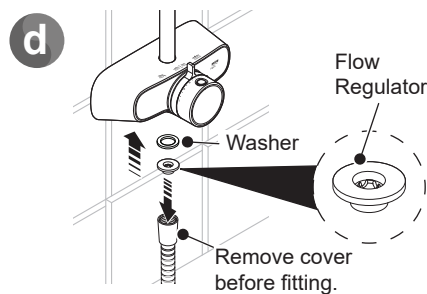
Put the concealing cover onto the wall fixing bracket.

Refit the lower bar into the mixing valve.

Push the upper bar mounting boss onto the wall fixing bracket until it clicks into place.

Important! Ensure that the locking peg clicks in and is fully engaged in the hole in the mounting boss.

Screw the fixed shower head onto the riser arm. (Install the flow regulator if required).

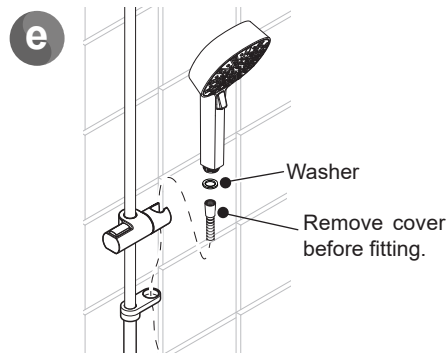


Fit the shower hose onto the bottom outlet of the mixing valve. (Install the flow regulator if required).

Information for Flow Regulators:

For maintained (running) water pressure greater than 0.5 bar, installing a flow regulator can help to reduce:

- Energy and water consumption
- Excessive shower force
- Noise due to high or unequal water pressure
- Unstable supply temperature
- Cooler outlet temperatures due to the colder seasons

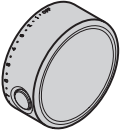


Push the shower hose through the retaining ring and screw it to the handshower. Make sure that the hose washer is fitted.

Place the handshower into the clamp bracket, adjusting the angle and height to the user's preference.

Warning! Slidebar must not be used as a grab rail.

Commissioning



Before turning water ON, turn valve fully anticlockwise to ensure that the valve is OFF.

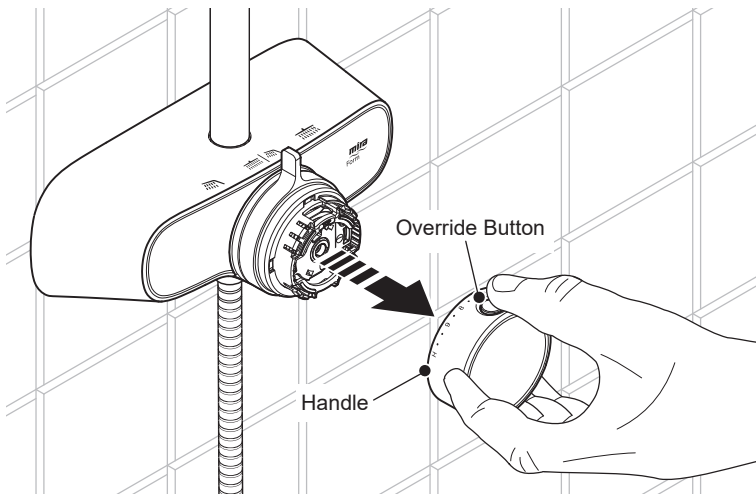
Maximum Temperature Setting

Before using the shower, the maximum temperature must be checked to make sure that it is at a safe level. It has been preset to a safe showering temperature under ideal conditions at the factory, appropriate for most systems. However, site conditions and personal preference may make it necessary to reset this temperature.

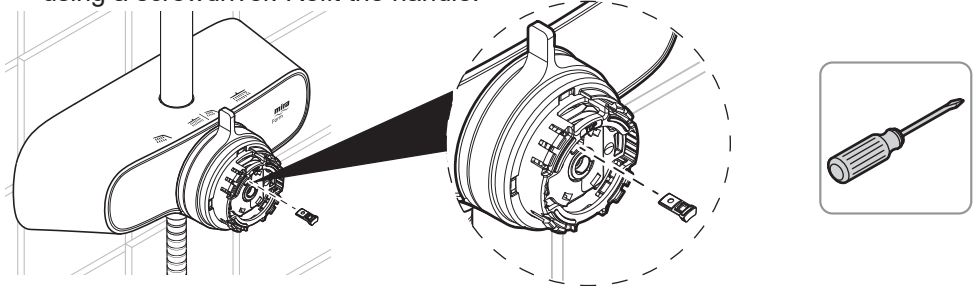
Note: Make sure that the hot water temperature is at least 55°C and that there is sufficient supply.

Caution! Before making any adjustments to the shower, operate the temp control from max hot to cold and make sure hot and cold water flows correctly from the shower outlet. After making any adjustments repeat this process.

1. Turn the temperature handle **clockwise** until it stops and test that the temperature of the water from the shower outlet is hot enough.
2. If not, depress the override button and **carefully** rotate the handle further. If the water temperature is still not hot enough complete the following procedure.
3. Rotate the handle clockwise until the override button faces upwards.
4. Press the override button, and carefully pull the top of the handle away from the shroud.



5. Lever out the yellow maximum temperature peg from the front of the valve by using a screwdriver. Refit the handle.



Note: Maximum temperature achievable is 49°C.

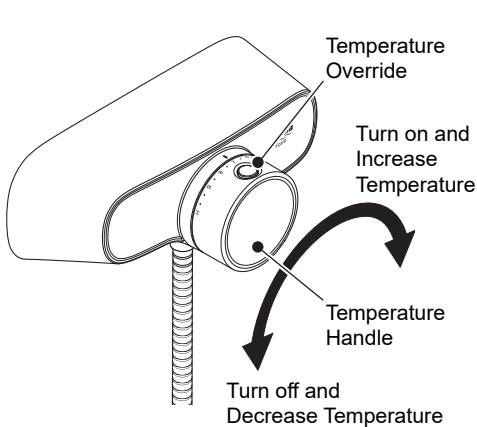
Operation

The dual outlet product has outlet selector to choose the desired outlet. User can individually choose the handshower or overhead by rotating the outlet selector. If outlet selector is set at 12 o'clock position, user can use handshower and overhead simultaneously.

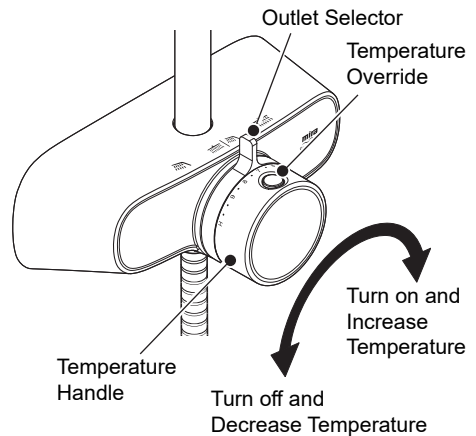
Important! Read the 'Safety Information' before using your shower.

Note: When diverting from handshower to overhead a small amount of cold water may initially flow.

On/Off and Temperature Control

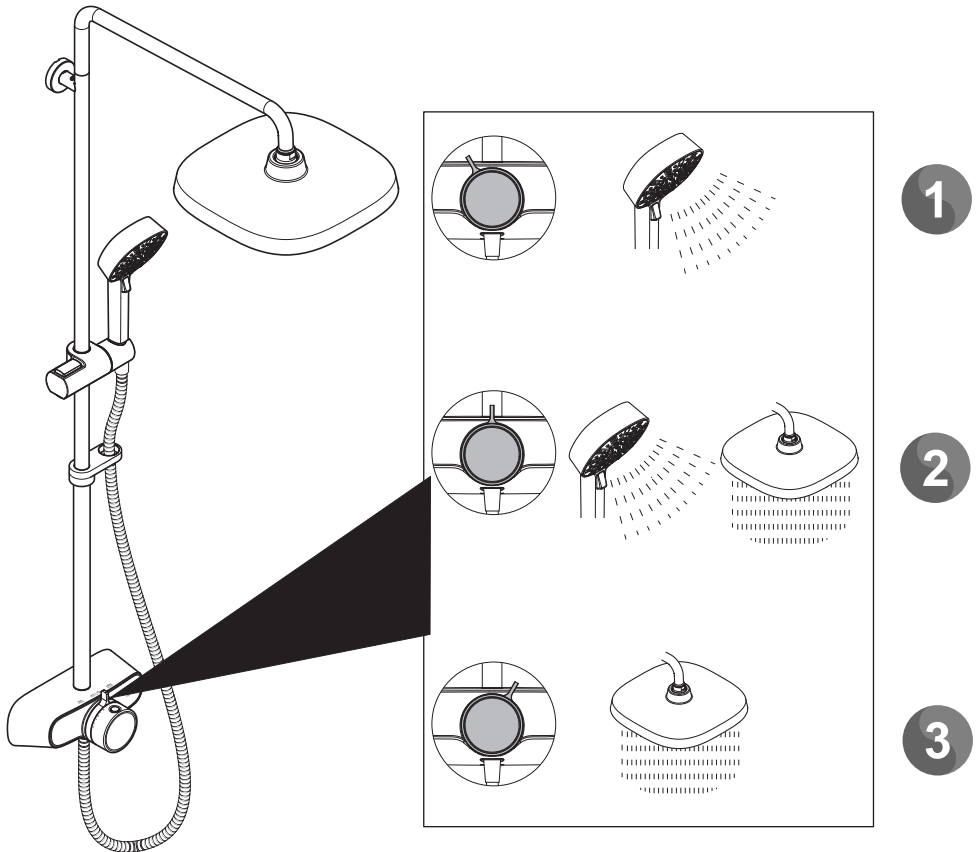


Single Outlet



Dual Outlet

The product turns ON and the temperature increases by rotating the temperature handle in the clockwise direction. Operate the shower and make sure it delivers cold water initially and then further rotate to increase temperature. For safety reasons, the temperature is limited by an override stop button. To obtain a higher temperature, press the override button on the temperature handle and continue to rotate the handle clockwise. Rotate the handle anti-clockwise to reduce temperature and turn OFF the product



Control Lever Position 1 -

Water comes out of the handshower.

Control Lever Position 2 -

At this point water will come out of both the overhead and the handshower.

Note: With some water systems there may be insufficient water flow to operate both outlets together.

Control Lever Position 3 -

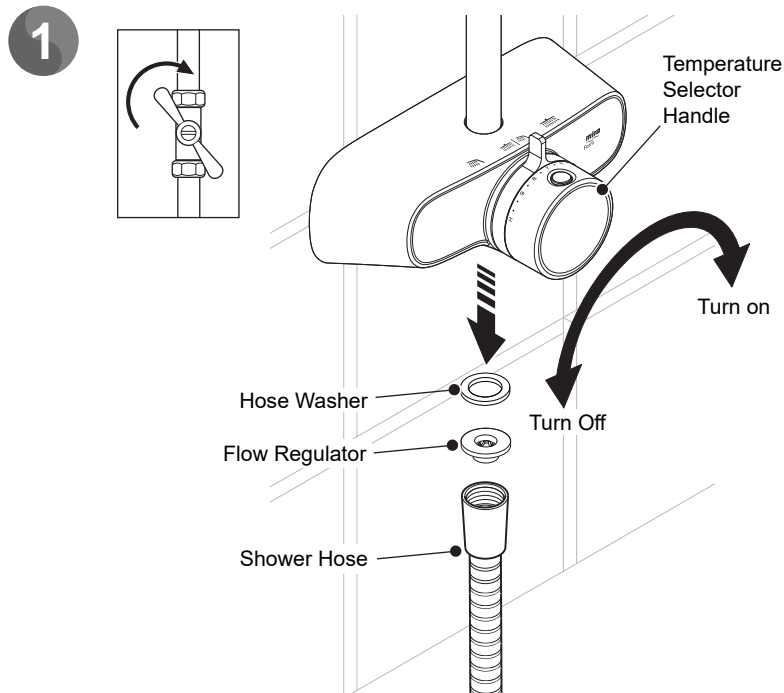
Water comes out of the overhead.

User Maintenance

WARNING! PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING TO REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY OR PRODUCT DAMAGE:

- **DO NOT** allow children to clean or perform any user maintenance to the shower unit without supervision.
- If the shower is not to be used for a long period, the water supply to the shower unit should be isolated. If the shower unit or pipework is at risk of freezing during this period, a qualified, competent person should drain them of water.

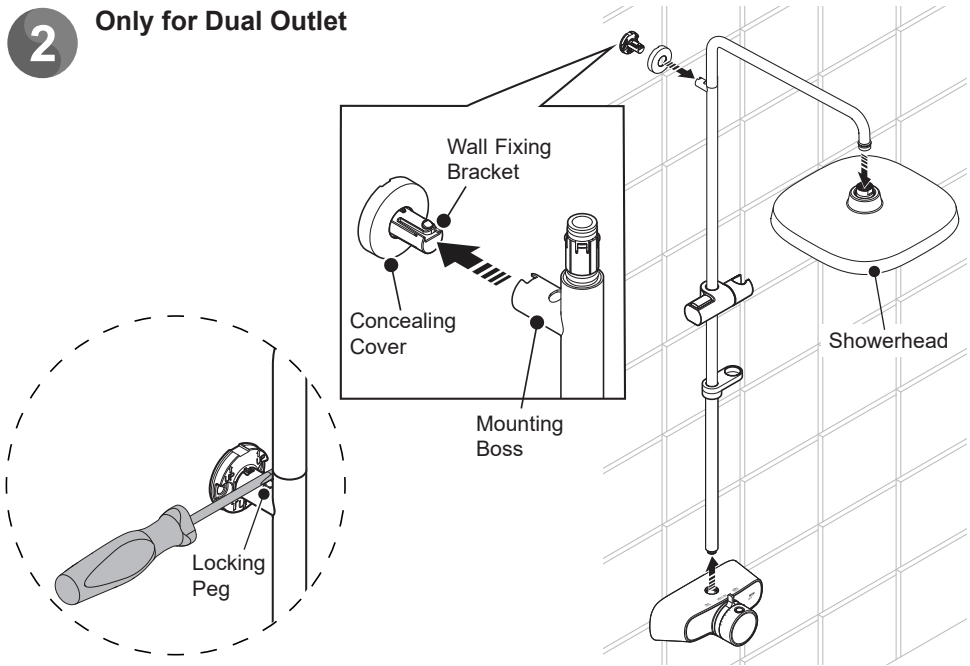


Isolate the water supplies and turn the shower on to relieve the water pressure.

Turn OFF the shower.

Disconnect the hose from the shower unit. Retain all parts carefully for reinstallation.

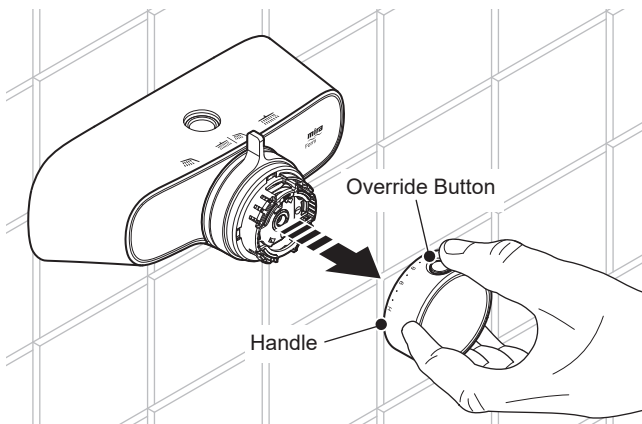

Carefully remove the showerhead from the fittings.

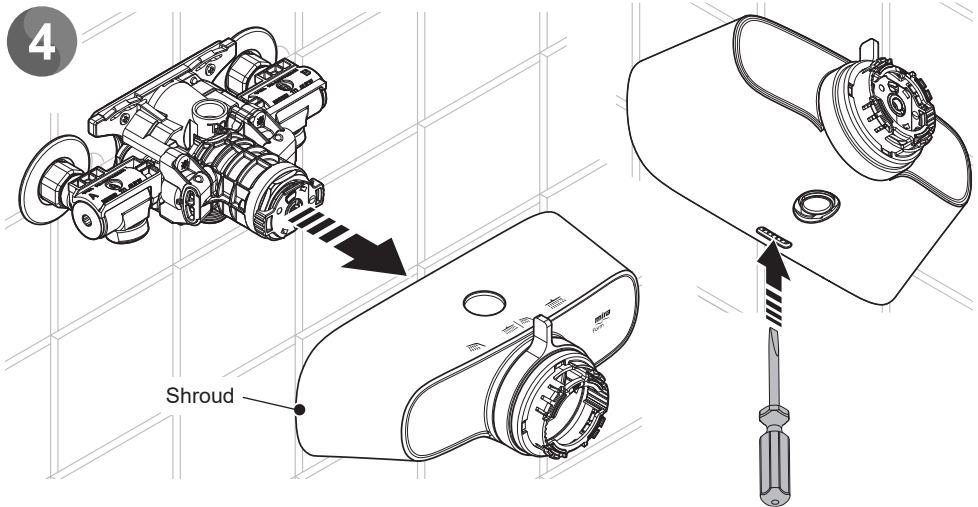
Use a screwdriver sideways to push and hold down the locking peg through the hole in the mounting boss on the upper bar and pull off shower fittings and concealing cover from the wall fixing bracket then remove the lower bar from the mixing valve.

Retain all parts for reinstallation.

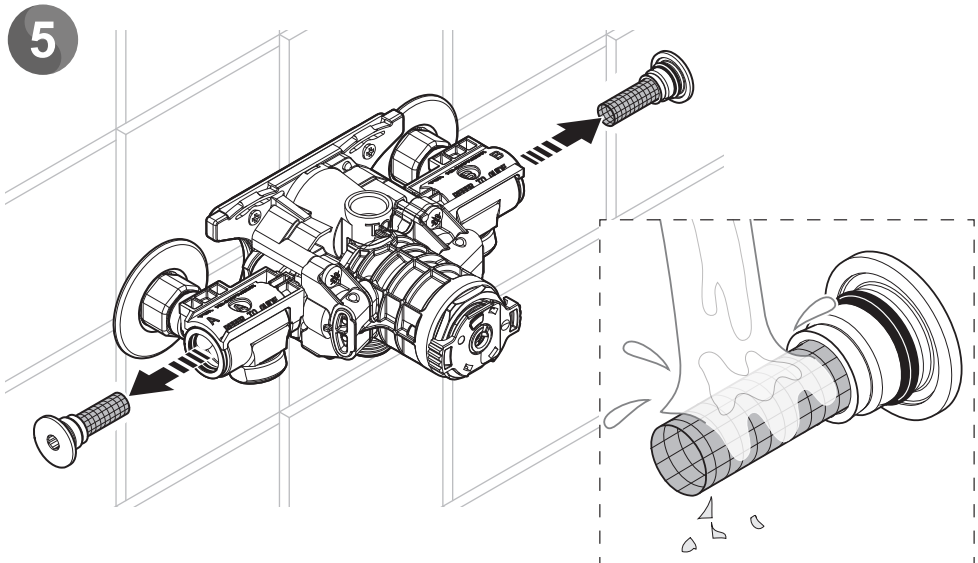


Rotate the handle clockwise until the override button faces upwards. Press the override button, and carefully pull the top of the handle away from the shroud.

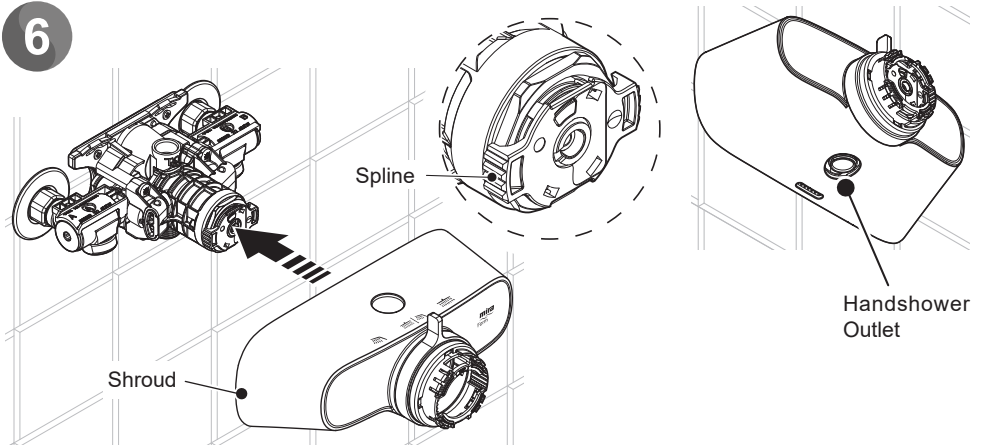


Locate the hole on the underside of a valve, and using a small flat blade screwdriver, gently rotate the screwdriver to lever off the shroud.

Pull off the shroud from valve assembly.



Remove the inlet filters using 6 mm hex key. Rinse the filters in clean water, removing any dirt or debris. Wipe the inside of the elbow with a clean cloth to remove any remaining debris. Replace if the filter mesh is damaged.



Note: Ensure that the spline is oriented in line as shown above.

Slide the shroud over the valve and push until clipped. Ensure outlets are in the correct position and drive features match. The shroud should click and clip into place.

Pull the shroud gently to ensure it is properly clipped into place.

Refit the handle and shower fittings in reverse order.

Restore the water supplies and check for leaks.

Cleaning

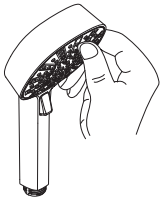

Cleaning the showerhead

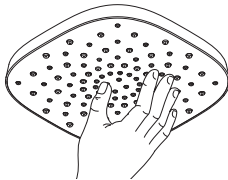
Many household and commercial cleaners, including hand and surface cleaning wipes contain abrasive and chemical substances that can damage plastics, plating and printing and should not be used. These finishes should be cleaned with a mild washing up detergent or soap solution, and then wiped dry using a soft cloth.

De-scaling the Showerhead and inspecting the hose

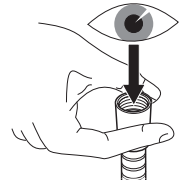
It is IMPORTANT to keep the Showerhead and Hose clean and free from blockage to make sure your shower performs to its optimum. The showerhead MUST be regularly cleaned and the hose MUST be regularly inspected to ensure there is no internal collapse or blockage that could reduce the flow.



Use your thumb or a soft cloth to wipe any limescale from the soft nozzles.



Unscrew the hose from the handshower and the shower outlet.



Inspect the hose.

Warning! Failure to keep the showerhead nozzles clear or inspect the hose for blockage or internal/external collapse can restrict the flow rate from the shower. This may cause damage to the shower or result in the temperature delivered to the user rising to unsafe levels with a risk of scalding. You MUST ALWAYS check the temperature before using the shower.

Fault Diagnosis

If you require a Mira trained service engineer or agent, refer to **'Customer Service'**.

Symptom	Cause/Rectification
Water too hot or too cold	Inlets reversed (hot supply to cold supply). Refer to page 19 to reverse the Inlet supplies Check filters for any blockage. Check the maximum temperature setting (If you have a combination type boiler it may not be producing sufficient hot water at the desired flow rate). Fit a flow regulator to the shower valve outlet. Installation conditions outside operating parameters. Refer to Specifications and Commissioning.
Poor temperature control	Make sure that the inlet temperature differentials are sufficient, refer to 'Specifications'. If fitted to a combi boiler ensure there is sufficient pressure and flow to deliver a constant hot water inlet supply. Check the shower handset, hose and inlet filters for any blockage and clean where necessary.
Fluctuating or reduced flow	Check the shower handset, hose and filters for any blockage. Make sure that the maintained inlet pressures are nominally balanced and sufficient. Refer to Specifications. Air lock or partial blockage in the pipework.
Water leaking from the shower handset/overhead	Normal for a short period after shut off. Check that the pressures are not in excess of the specifications for this product. There may be occasions where the overhead shower or shower handset empties for a while after the shower has been used, this is due to changes in ambient temperatures and is normal. It is recommended that all outlets are therefore enclosed within the water catchment area.
